



Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act (FIPPA)

The Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act (FIPPA), proclaimed in October of 1993, was extended to local public bodies, such as schools, in the fall of 1994.

We ask your permission to use information about our child from time to time in celebrating their success in school. For example:

Displaying photograph(s) and/or other information regarding your child:

- On a bulletin board, newsletter or brochure.
- In a school yearbook.
- In the local newspaper.

or

- Posting birthday announcements.
- Posting on the school website and/or social media site(s).
- Displaying, creating or posting digital media projects.
- Sharing information to YouLearn's Parent Advisory Council (PAC) for the purposes of school related communications.

Upon registration, guardians can confirm whether they agree or do not agree with the disclosure of personal information.

The purpose of the act is to promote the general principles that provincial government information should be available to the public, and that the personal information respecting individuals held by the government, including educational bodies, should not be improperly disclosed.
